INTRODUCTION

Access to medical services and care to the people is one of the fundamental human rights that everyone is entitled to. Unfortunately, due to high levels of poverty, unemployment and the growing gap between the rich and the poor, access to the medical services is slowly becoming the privilege of those who can afford. This situation is being exacerbated by the dire shortage of health care professional in the public health institutions. With a national average life expectance of 49 years and a spiraling HIV and AIDS prevalence, South Africa is facing a huge challenge to the health needs of the people.

The World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY) working with its partners have in the past ten years been complimenting Government efforts in providing health care services to the indigent communities. Over the years, the WAMY Clinic Day has evolved to be a flagship annual event designed to bring health care services to the door steps of the poor people.

PROCEEDING OF THE 2012 MEDICAL AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

The 2012 Medical and community outreach program took place in Umlazi Township, Ward 83, M Section at Ngilozi Junior Primary School. The rationale for the selection of this venue is that, Umlazi M section is home to many impoverished household with most of them relying on child or old age grant for their sustenance.

The Clinic Day was officially opened by the Ward 83 Councilor Mr. M.B. Xhakaza. In his opening remarks, the Councilor thanked WAMY and its partners for choosing Ngilozi Junior Primary School to host the Medical and community outreach program. He lamented the worsening health condition of the people due to unhealthy lifestyles and unhygienic living conditions. He urged the people to work closely with his office and other stakeholders to ensure that people live in health surroundings and seek medical attention whenever they are ill. The Councilor urged WAMY to consider having more of such community initiatives to meet the growing health needs of the people.

WAMY Director, Sheikh Saleem Banda acknowledged Al-Baraka Bank and other partners in making the Medical and community outreach program possible. He complimented the School Governing Body and the School Principal for making the School available for the Clinic Day on a busy day like Sunday when the School is used by Churches for congregation. Sheikh Saleem Banda called on the people to desist from unhealthy lifestyles such consumption of alcohol and abuse of drugs. WAMY is concerned with the deteriorating moral fiber in our communities which are contributing to crime and violence, we need to build safe communities for everyone, remarked Sheikh Saleem Banda.

OUTCOMES

The following were tangible outcomes of the Medical and community outreach program;

- Increased access to medical services- 18 were referred to the Hospital.
- Free consultation and medication-389 patients were seen by Doctors and received Medication.
- Increased awareness on health issues through health education
- Improved public opinion about Islam (16 people accepted Islam)
- Created community visibility of WAMY and its partners
